To learn to listen critically to a wide range of cultures and traditions to gain a deep understanding of how music is constructed and the impact it can have on the listener.

Through good vocal production, careful listening and well-developed sense of pitch, pupils should be able to sing in harmony and with musical delivery.

Integrity

Pupils can express their thoughts on performances in a supportive environment. This will develop listening skills and musical vocabulary.
